HOW DO I COLLECT PRIZES?

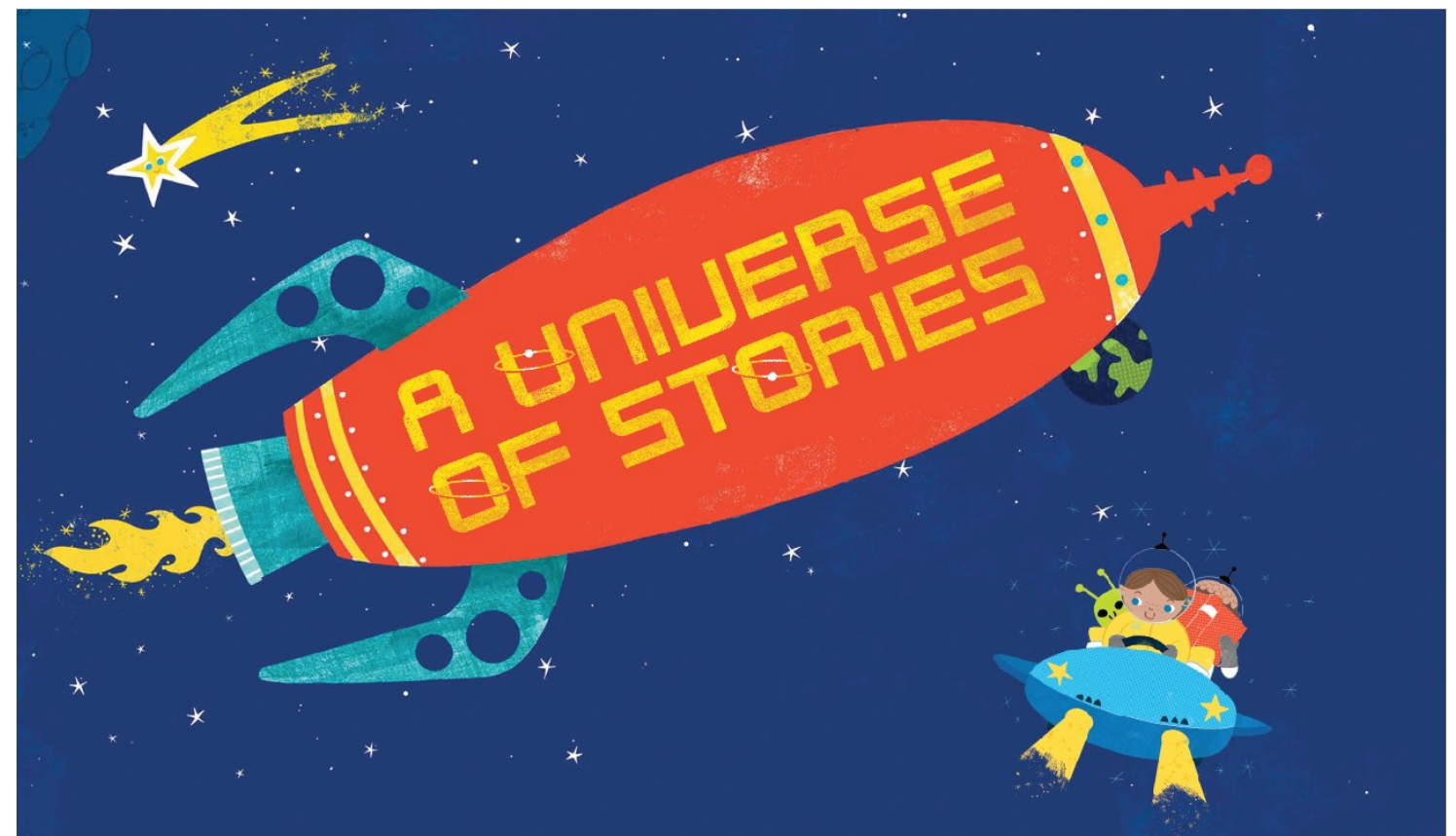
